Gerald Sanchez, Assistant County Attorney inquired regarding whether it would be permissible under the Florida Sunshine Law, Section 286.011, Florida Statutes, for a County Commissioner, who has observed something in another Commissioner's district that could be of interest to the other Commissioner, to forward the information by written communication to the other Commissioner. Mr. Sanchez was advised that, in order to comply with the Sunshine Law as well as to avoid any appearance of impropriety, the best way to accomplish that would be to forward the information to the other Commissioner in writing or by email through the Clerk of the Board, with cc's to all other Commissioners, and to state in the communication that there should be no reply to it, thereby making it a public record in the custody of the Clerk, avoiding any two-way communication, and insuring tranasparency.
