Councilwoman DiGiacomo:

You have inquired concerning the necessity to have minutes taken during informal workshops of the Council on matters coming up in front of the Council for a vote, as well as the necessity of taking minutes of shade meetings held for the purpose of union negotiations.

Any workshop meeting involving more than one member of the Town Council must be held in accordance with the Sunshine Law, F.S. 286.011, Florida Statutes, which explicitly requires that minutes be taken of such meetings and kept as public records.

Under Section 447.605, Florida Statutes, a discussion between the chief executive officer of a municipality or his or her representative, and the legislative body of the municipality is exempt from the provisions of Section 286.011, which means that the requirement for taking minutes would not be applicable to such discussions. The purpose of this exemption is to allow for confidential strategizing and informational exchange between executive and legislative branches prior to the negotiations, and does not apply to meetings among members of the legislative body alone or to the actual negotiations.
