PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER

Complainant, Stephanie Kienzle (Kienzle), filed this complaint against Mary Estime-Irvin (Estime-Irvin), Commissioner of the City of North Miami Beach. Kienzle alleged that during the course of the investigation into a previous complaint filed against Estime-Irvin¹ she lied about having a City-owned cell phone, in violation of the Citizens' Bill of Rights Truth in Government provision.

Investigation determined that Estime-Irvin does not have a City issued/owned cell phone. She has a privately-owned phone that she utilizes as her "dedicated City business phone." The investigation determined that Estime-Irvin was referring to her "City business dedicated phone" in her previous statement to the COE and not to a City issued/owned cell phone.

Accordingly, Estime-Irvin's previous statement regarding her cell phone was truthful.

On June 10, 2020, in closed session, the Ethics Commission's Advocate recommended that the case be dismissed for lack of probable cause. In open session, the Ethics Commission voted unanimously to find No Probable Cause and dismissed the case.

Wherefore it is:

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that COMPLAINT C20-16-03 against Respondent, Mary Estimé-Irvin, is hereby dismissed.
