The nepotism provisions are spelled out in a County Administrative Order and the Florida Statutes. Our office doesn't enforce this rule; however, I can assure you that under state law there is no exception for seasonal employees. In other words, you can't be involved in the hiring decision, nor the his evaluation. If he will be supervised by others, it shouldn't present a problem.
