Ms. Rubin,

As a general rule, I am opposed to the practice of allowing County employees to have business cards printed that include one's work e-mail and phone number when these cards are being utilized for a non-County purpose. However, due to the nature of work you are performing as director of a land trust without compensation and the fact the County is not paying the printing expenses of these business cards, then printing your County contact information on these cards is permissible. An incidental or occasion e-mail to you when you are on County time is fine, it only becomes a problem if you are neglecting your County responsibilities at the expense of land trust issues presented to you during working hours.
