Hi Cindy,

A member of an advisory committee can abstain only in cases where the member receives a legal opinion stating the member has a conflict of interest, or if the committee member believes in good faith that he/she has a conflict of interest. If no real or perceived conflict of interest exists, then the committee member must vote. A board member who has a conflict can actually stay in the room and participate in the discussion as long as he/she doesn't vote. Our office doesn't particularly like the idea that a person can participate and try to influence others and then abstain. We would prefer that a person with a conflict stays out of the discussion.
