

Lauderdale Air and Sea Show Media Day at Miami Executive Aviation, which is located in the Opa Locka Airport. A monumental victory celebration will be held upon arrival at Miami Executive Aviation. Also, an educational post tour will take place to promote careers in aviation.



Why Aerospace is Significant to the Economy:

The aerospace sector of our economy generates economic activity equal to nearly 15% of the nation's Gross Domestic Product and supports approximately 11 million American jobs. In 2004, low-cost and regional carrier net profits were \$740 million and cargo reported net profit was \$832 million.



Community Need/Dilemma:

- The US Department of Labor forecasts that in 2012 the US economy will have the largest workforce in the nation's history - more than 162 million. However, it will not be enough to fill more than 165 million jobs projected to be available.
- NASA estimates that American colleges will turn out only 198,000 engineers to take the place of the 2 million baby boomers scheduled to retire by 2008. The average age of the aerospace manufacturing employee is now 51; the same number of engineers rises to 54.
- According to the FAA, in 2004 the number of passengers rose from 642 million to 688 million. Commercial aviation remains on track to exceed one billion passengers by 2015.
- NASA's strategic plan estimates that as domestic and international airports reach full capacity without adequate expansion, the airline industry could lose \$20 billion in output and forfeit up to 200 billion passenger miles by 2015.
- According to the FAA, the number of commercial aircraft is forecasted to grow from 7,832 in 2004 to 11,272 in 2016. Cargo jets are expected to increase from 974 to 1,312.
- Studies done by the Organization of Black Airline Pilots on ethnic diversity, discovered that less than 2 percent of Commercial Pilots are African American and less than 3 percent are of Hispanic origin.
- In 2001, according to the FAA, only 4.9 percent of commercial aviation pilot were women and only 1.7 percent of aircraft mechanic jobs were held by women.

Working now, Experience Aviation will have the opportunity to help revitalize the markets and human capital of an industry that is critical to our freedom, mobility and prosperity. Without a sturdy workforce, the nation may miss several opportunities to develop "breakthrough capabilities". No source is more valuable than human and intellectual capital.







FMU Student Prepares To Take Flight



Florida Memorial University student Barrington A. Irving is preparing to make Aviation history. The 21-year-old senior plans to become the first African-American and the youngest person of any race to fly a single engine aircraft around the world.

The aircraft selected for this historical voyage is the Lancair Columbia 350. This aircraft is said to be economical and best equipped, making it the logical choice for the completion of this flight which will depart May 4, 2006.

Although Barrington he is currently studying Aeronautical Science with a 3.7 cumulative grade point average, he wasn't always interested in Aviation. He played football for Miami Northwestern Senior High School, and had dreams of playing professional football. He even had scholarship offers to play at various colleges and universities. However, once he got the opportunity to take a tour of an aircraft and sit in the cockpit, that was all it took for him to get hooked on Aviation.

He admits that he was worried about going into Aviation at

first. "I thought I had to be a rocket scientist to do this, but as time went on, I knew it was something I can do," said Irving. The Jamaican native never in his wildest dreams would have thought he would be going through with such a journey. "The funny thing is that I'm scared of heights. I'm afraid to stand at the edge of a building but I don't mind flying an airplane," he expressed.

With the help of FMU, Barrington has created and developed a non-profit organization entitled "Experience Aviation" which is designed to address the significant shortage of younger, technically skilled professionals in

aviation and aerospace. "Being the president of this program, my main focus is to inspire youth of all ages to get involved in aviation," said Irving. In addition he spends time visiting inner-city schools and volunteers for organizations such as Miami-Dade Empowerment Trust, Tuskegee Airmen, Organization of Black Airline Pilots, Take Stock in Children, and 5,000 Role Models. His organization is now three years old and its popularity is expected to grow once Barrington returns from his historic journey.

Committed to making this trip occur Barrington needed sponsors, and that he did get. At

this point he has raised a value of \$65,000 and received \$1000,000 in scholarship funds in order to prepare for this historic endeavor. He is a recipient of the Florida Memorial/U.S. Air Force Flight Awareness Scholarship, Florida Bright Future Scholarship, and has the support of Congressman Kendrick Meek, all of which will help him on his journey.

At a young age Barrington had to overcome many negative influences to arrive at this point. "I've seen a lot of things that the average person my age shouldn't have, but thanks to God I am able to have a better lifestyle and I hope the aviation industry will help me make it off the streets," said Irving. His popularity has definitely grown since starting Experience Aviation. He has received many offers to work with different airlines including the military. However his goal is to work with the kids in the community.

Barrington's future goals consist of becoming a commercial airline pilot, developing an educational institution that will inspire youth to pursue careers in aviation and aerospace, and continuing to enhance minority achievements in aviation.

Hurricane Katrina Hits FMU


The goal of this year's law Enforcement Forum is to reinforce ties between students, law enforcement and the community.

"Schoolhouse" in School House

Florida Memorial University felt the need to bring some art in the school. So the school set up a committee that voted on several art pieces submitted by several artists. The piece chosen is called "Schoolhouse" done by artist Connie Lloveras who gave her description of the piece....

The monument is intended to define a place where there is a free exchange of knowledge and ideas and wisdom is handed down for the intellectual and spiritual growth of future generations. The artwork consists of five cast concrete structures ranging in height between 5'7" and 6'2". They are painted forms that will be anchored into a

9" thick concrete slab. The structural forms and encased by an aluminum frame that will be fabricated out of 3" square tubing, and there will be 18' square concrete stepping stones that lead from two of the walkways to the installation.

The concrete structures have a human scale and are reminiscent of male and female forms. They contain etchings of random letters and patterns from ancient written languages. The structures make reference to the origins of the African culture. The aluminum frame implies a house or institution, yet the absence of walls makes a rather abstract connotation allowing the house to become an interactive invitation for the viewer or pedestrian.



Want Success at FMU? Get Your CSI Report

Do you know one of the single, greatest, non-financial causes for failure and dropout at FMU? Ironically, it is also one of the most powerful reasons why student stay at FMU and do well! Give up? The answer may surprise you - Your friends! Who you hang with and how much time you spend with them! Or better stated - Peer relations and what kind of influence they have on you!

That's right, you've heard it before - hang with the wrong crowd and you will most likely not be around here very long. It's true! Why? Because the wrong crowd or certain friends have the wrong values! They prioritize having fun, socializing, being cool, being popular, hanging out, partying or "chillin". Of course, some of those things are good to do every now and then to reduce stress; but if they occur everyday and become more important to you than your desire to finish college - if they come before studying and focusing on doing well academically - then give it a little time and you will be gone from FMU. You'll be a dropout and most likely on your way to a life of misery and hardship.

Of course, you can blame the school, or professors, or your roommates or "whatever", but the real problem probably lies within you.



You see, every student has many qualities, but two of the most important are Self-Reliance and Sociability. Those qualities and many more associated with college success are included in the College Student Inventory or CSI. This inventory is administered by The Partnering for Success Program (PSP) to all freshmen during Orientation week. A few weeks later, every student can get a copy of their "CSI Report" from their advisor.

Anyway, the College Student Inventory or CSI measures Self-reliance and defines it as "the degree that you trust your own judgement and make your own decisions. Low Self-reliance can express itself in various ways: spending too much time seeking companionship; going along with social activities that violate your values; feeling uncomfortable with

the solitude of studying". Obviously, students with low Self-reliance are followers, not leaders. They are insecure and desperately want to be accepted by others - they want to be seen as cool by others so they go along with the crowd and do foolish things that they know they shouldn't be doing. They get kicked out of school and give up their lives - just so they can appear to be cool in front of people they've known for only a few days or weeks!

Similarly, the CSI defines Sociability as "your desires for companionship and social entertainment. An above-average level of sociability has the advantage of motivating you to establish friendships and spend a lot of time with other people. But it can distract you from the main purpose of college, which is learning. Try

to keep your social life within reasonable bounds". In other words, spending a moderate amount of time with friends can help establish a good support network that may keep you in school; but if you overdo it, then you'll be spending too much time socializing and not enough time studying and focusing on school. You've got to find a balance!

So, are you the type of person who will go along with friends and do something irresponsible just to impress them? Also, did you come to college to party or did you come to get an education? Why don't you find out by checking out your "Self-Reliance" and "Sociability" scores on your CSI Report. (Your freshmen Advisors can give you a copy of your report. Or come by the PSP Program located in the Counseling Center for a copy).

It's better to know now rather than later. A high Self-Reliance score and an average Sociability score are the best combination. Check yours out!

In fact, back at home he's already blowing up. "It's kind of hard to walk around without someone wanting to take a picture with me, but it's cool," said Thomas. Leon is also talented with drums, which is actually his favorite instrument.

However unlike Michael Jordan attempt at a professional baseball career, he is sticking with his strengths for now.

The Common Motivational Hot Potato – Drop it Like its Hot!

To my Florida Memorial University students. Does the idea of starting that Science paper give you fever? Does the thought of doing one more page of your Criminal Justice homework break you out in a sweat? Drop it like its hot! It happens. Many students get scorched by the occasional motivational hot potato. You've Snoop Dogg's "Drop it like its hot." Here are five "Drop it like its hot" suggestions to help you back in action.

FIRST: DROP TRIVIAL TASK LIKE IT'S HOT! Focus on High-Capacity Study Activities. It may seem obvious, but it's easy to let trivial tasks distract you from more important studies. Smaller projects are often easier and quickly offer a sense of accomplishment, but drop it like its hot! Don't minor in the major and major in the minor. Keep in mind, that even though this sense of accomplishment feels good it tends to be short-lived, and you will discover that which matters most is still not done.

SUGGESTION: Make a list in two columns - Column 1: What are your most important tasks? Column 2: What's on your to-do list?

If your items in column 2 have little to do with your objectives in column 1, you have a problem. Drop it like its hot! To solve it, you may need to rearrange your time and devote more energy toward what counts. This will help you build momentum.

SECOND: DROP UNSUCCESSFUL ROUTINES LIKE IT'S HOT! Create New Challenges. If you always do what you've always done, you will always get what you always got. Drop it like its hot!

When you start to feel uninterested with something, try changing your approach. For example: You've been given an assignment similar to one you've done in the past, think about how you can solve this problem in a different way or improve upon your previous work.

THIRD: DROP "I CAN'T" THOUGHTS LIKE IT'S HOT! You can set attainable goals. A number of students have big dreams but have difficulty translating them into concrete steps. The key is to think "one step at a time." Think "I can" short-term, and only long-term. For example, if you're having trouble writing a 20-page paper for class because it seems too large, don't say "I can't" because you are focusing on that final number, drop it

like its hot! Say "I can" by considering each section of your paper individually. Now you're dealing with a familiar task, not unlike papers you've written before.

FOURTH: DROP THE "LONE RANGER" ATTITUDE LIKE IT'S HOT! Find a Support Network. In almost any school setting, there are Role Models who can give you guidance and help you develop new skills. Plus, there are peers who can motivate you by listening and exchanging ideas. Drop the "Lone Ranger" attitude like its hot! Both role models and peers are important elements of a support network, which is also a great resource for information and for new ways to challenge yourself.

FIFTH AND FINALLY: DROP "HOPSCOTCHING" ASSIGNMENTS LIKE IT'S HOT! Celebrate Your Accomplishments. When you've got momentum going, it's tempting to "hopscotch," that is jump from task to task, drop it like its hot! What hopscotching tends to do is stress you out, and give you a feeling of not getting enough done. Instead, pause after you've completed an assignment give yourself a quick reward. Treat yourself to a movie, splurge on a lunch or dinner – whatever works for you do it.

"The average golfer drives the ball about 140 yards, I was driving the ball 170 yard" said Rey. From there he played in the Golden Bear Tournament which was a professional tournament. Even though he placed dead last in the tournament he realized that he could hang with the pro's. He took the opportunity to ask a lot of questions and observed a lot of new tricks that he will use in his

own game.

His greatest motivation comes from his mother and father who are still residing in the Virgin Islands. "The day that I can carry my parents on my back, is the day when I feel fulfilled," said Rey. From an athletic standpoint, he looks up to the great Tiger Woods. "Seeing him play at the Doral, motivated me to take it to the next level," said Rey.

To make his dreams come true, Rey practices daily for ten hours with a hired instructor, rain or sunshine. Even though it's still a long shot, Rey is very confident that he will make it. With the heart of a Lion he will continue swinging for success.


