Re:	Everglades Restoration and Flood Protection Resolution

I received your memorandum earlier today in which you indicated that you are in need of an opinion regarding the abovementioned resolution. I can confirm that Bob Ginsburg, you and I met in your office last month and we spoke about your sponsorship of this particular resolution. Mr. Ginsburg and I had that same initial reaction; that is, there seemed to be no conflict of interest for you to sponsor this item. However, please understand that I do not have the legal authority to issue you a formal and binding written opinion on this matter; this power solely rests with the Ethics Commission.

The Ethics Commission ordinance describes the process by which formal opinions are given. It requires a written request submitted to our office. Once the written request is received, staff prepares a draft opinion and the item is scheduled for an Ethics Commission meeting. Once the Ethics Commission has had the opportunity to review the draft opinion at a public meeting, a written opinion will be issued. As soon as the Ethics Commission renders an opinion, I will immediately make it available for you. The Ethics Commission meets again on Wednesday, March 29<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 a.m.

It is conceivable that a special meeting of the Ethics Commission could be called to address this question. If you would like me to attempt to arrange a special meeting prior to March 29th, please contact me at your earliest convenience.

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## **RESOLUTION NO**

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE RESTORATION OF THE EVERGLADES, THE FAIR DISTRIBUTION OF WATER TO URBAN AND AGRICULTURAL USERS AND THE EQUITABLE ALLOCATION OF NON-FEDERAL COSTS AMONG STATE AND REGIONAL INTERESTS

WHEREAS, the Governor's Commission for the Everglades is overseeing the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Project (CERP), concerning the restoration of the Everglades and ensuring future water supplies for urban and agricultural users, and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County wholeheartedly recognizes the importance of a restored Everglades as a national, state and regional priority, along with the fair distribution of water to urban users and agriculture; and

WHEREAS, current funding proposals for the CERP do not allocate costs equitably among all state, regional and local interests, and require adjustment, and

WHEREAS, the impact of implementation of the CERP on flooding is not known at this time and significant areas of South Florida are subject to frequent and severe flooding,

WHEREAS, flood protection is part of the mission of the South Florida Water Management District, and limited evaluation of flooding impacts in urban and agricultural areas was conducted in the development of the CERP, and

WHEREAS, Congressman Danie Fascell's PL 101-229 of 1989 authorized the Modified Water Deliveries Project for the purpose of improving natural water flows to the Everglades and providing flood protection to residents in West Miami-Dade County, and this Act was based upon the recommendations of two Governor's Commissions in which Miami-Dade County participated and concurred (Gov. Graham, 1985, and Governor Martinez, 1988), including one of which was chaired by Miami-Dade County Manager Ray Goode (1988); and

WHEREAS, the CERP has numerous projects proposed within the area of the Lower East Coast which benefit the overall system, but are expensive to construct, operate and maintain, e.g., two wastewater re-use plants planned to be located in Miami-Dade County.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> Miami-Dade County fully supports the restoration of the Everglades ecosystem, along with the fair distribution of water to urban and agricultural users, and that

<u>Section 2.</u> The Governor's Commission for the Everglades should reaffirm that the fundamental guiding principle for the entire Everglades restoration effort shall be "Shared Benefit, Shared Burden", and that

<u>Section 3.</u> The non-Federal capital funding of the CERP should be equitably shared throughout all of the State of Florida, however, if the Governor's proposal for funding is approved, the regional share of capital funding should be equitably shared among the sixteen counties under the jurisdiction of the South Florida Water Management District, and that

<u>Section 4.</u> The costs of operations, maintenance and monitoring of all plan components, including "new technology at this scale" (e.g. re-use plants, Aquifer Storage and Retrieval (ASR), etc.), must be shared with the federal government, as well, and that

<u>Section 5.</u> The availability of the regional water resources for all users be equitably distributed and the location of "new technology at this scale" facilities be spread equitably

throughout the entire watershed, providing additional available water upstream for equitable distribution to all downstream users, and that

<u>Section 6.</u> The Army Corps of Engineers and the South Florida Water Management District must act to ensure that proposed components of the plan will maintain or enhance existing levels of flood protection in all urban, agricultural and environmental preservation areas, and that

<u>Section 7.</u> The Army Corps of Engineers and the South Florida Water Management District must commit to the people of South Florida that the various related projects under consideration will not result in adverse water quality or flooding impacts anywhere in Miami-Dade County, and that

Section 8. The Army Corps of Engineers and the South Florida Water Management District should act to expeditiously implement the Modified Water Deliveries Project, which was authorized by Congressman Dante Fascell's PL 101-229 in 1989 for the purpose of improving natural water flows to the Everglades and providing flood protection to residents of West Miami-Dade County, including the protections required by section 104(c), PL 101-229.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Commissioner Pedro Reboredo and offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
