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How to Run a Clean Campaign

Citizens considering running for elected office can learn how to do it right by attending the next Campaign Skills Seminar sponsored by the Miami-Dade Commission on Ethics and Public Trust.

The seminar, at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, April 7, 2011, at the North Miami Police Department's Community Service Room, will provide essential information on fundraising and record keeping to candidates, campaign treasurers, volunteers and anyone who wants to understand the legal and ethical obligations of seeking public office. Speakers include representatives of the Miami-Dade Ethics Commission, the State Attorney's Office and the Elections Department.

The event is free and open to the public. Attorneys can earn Continuing Legal Education credits from the Florida Bar.
