**PUBLIC REPORT AND ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT**

Mattie Lomax filed the above-captioned complaint against Alan Adrian Taylor ("Respondent") for alleged violation of Section 2-11.1(g) (misuse of official position). The complaint alleged the Respondent improperly wrote a legal memorandum regarding the contempt charges against Lomax.

The Respondent is a staff attorney for the Eleventh Judicial Circuit. The Respondent authored a legal memorandum which analyzed the grounds for indirect criminal contempt for a violation of Fla. R. Jud. Admin 2.410. Fla. R. Jud. Admin 2.410 provides that "no person other than judges and authorized court employees shall remove court records...except by an order of the chief judge or chief justice upon a showing of good cause." The complaint alleged the Respondent conspired with the deputy clerk to have false contempt charges filed against Lomax.


On December 19, 2007, the Ethics Commission found the complaint legally insufficient because the Ethics Commission does not have jurisdiction over the Respondent. The Respondent is a state employee. Thereafter, after reviewing the complaint and being otherwise advised in the premises, the Ethics Commission ordered the complaint dismissed.

Therefore it is:

**ORDERED AND ADJUDGED THAT** the Complaint is **DISMISSED** for lack of jurisdiction.
