PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL DISMISSAL ORDER

Jack Morant, Jr., a former Solid Waste Management Department employee, filed the above-referenced complaint against unspecified employees of the Miami-Dade County Solid Waste Management Department.

The complainant faulted the County for his arrest in 1997 for accepting bribes. Specifically, he stated that he was inadequately trained about the type of materials that could be discarded at County trash and recycling facilities, and signage at the facilities was poor. These allegations, if true, occurred more than three years before the filing of this complaint on January 11, 2012.

Pursuant to the County Code at Sec. 2-1074 (x), no action may be taken by the Ethics Commission on a complaint filed more than three year after the violation is alleged to have occurred.

In public session on January 24, 2012, the Ethics Commission found that the complaint was barred from being adjudicated, based on the three-year Statute of Limitations, and dismissed it.


Therefore it is:
