PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER

Paul A. Calli (Calli), an attorney and private citizen, filed the above-referenced complaint against the Miami Shores Village Charter School Authority and its Board of Directors (Board) alleging that the Board conducted official action in the "shade", in violation of Section 286.011 of the Florida Statutes, commonly referred to as the "Sunshine Law."

The Ethics Commission does not have jurisdiction over the Sunshine Law.

A legally sufficient complaint exists where there are allegations of a violation of an ordinance within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission, purportedly committed by an individual within the authority of the Ethics Commission.

None of the allegations made by Calli fall under the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission. The matter was referred to the State Attorney's Office.

On June 17, 2015, in open session, the Ethics Commission dismissed this complaint as not legally sufficient based on the Advocates recommendation.


Therefore it is:
