Smith v Gilbert

PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER

Complainant, Dorothy Smith (Smith), filed this complaint against (1) Mayor Oliver Gilbert and all of the City of Miami Gardens City Council members; (2) Shirley Ransom-Jackson, Building Department; (3) Mike Gambino, Development Services Department; (4) Tom Ruiz, Public Works Department; (5) DR Horton, Inc.; and (6) the Coconut Cay Community Development District (CDD).

In the complaint, Smith alleged that there was a continuing issue of flooding in the Coconut Cay community that severely affects the quality of life of the people that reside in that community. Smith also alleged that DR Horton, Inc. failed to build a recreational center/or a club house in the community as they initially promised; and that the community's CDD was inappropriately misusing "public" funds and inappropriately seeking to raise the fees that the Coconut Cay residents pay.

On July 13, 2016 the Ethics Commission accepted the Advocate's recommendation, that this complaint was NOT LEGALLY SUFFICIENT because the allegations do not identify any violation of matters within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission and dismissed the case.

Wherefore it is:

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that COMPLAINT C16-22 against Mayor Oliver Gilbert and all of the City of Miami Gardens City Council members; Shirley Ransom-Jackson; Mike Gambino; Tom Ruiz; DR Horton, Inc.; and the Coconut Cay Community Development District (CDD) is concluded.
