CORRECTED PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER

Victor May (May), a resident of the Town of Surfside, filed this complaint against Town Attorney Linda Miller (Miller) and Special Master Aleksandr Boksner (Boksner). May alleged that Miller and Boksner committed possible constitutional violations in the imposition of civil fines for parking violations in the Town of Surfside.

A legally sufficient complaint exists where there are allegations of a violation of an ordinance within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission, purportedly committed by an individual within the authority of the Ethics Commission. The Ethics Commission does not enforce violations of the Fifth or Eighth Amendments of United States Constitution concerning double jeopardy or excessive fines respectively.

On August 10, 2016, in closed session, the Ethics Commission's Staff Attorney recommended that the case be dismissed. In open session, the Ethics Commission voted unanimously to find No Legal Sufficiency and dismissed the case.

Wherefore it is:

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that COMPLAINT C16-27 against Respondents, Linda Miller and Aleksandr Boksner, is hereby dismissed.
