**PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER**

Christopher Davis (Davis) filed this complaint against Respondent, Travis Kalanick (Kalanick). Davis is the CEO of Professional Chauffeur Transportation Services. Kalanick is the CEO of Uber Technologies, Inc. (Uber).

Davis alleged that Kalanick engaged in unregistered lobbying with Commissioner Audrey Edmonson in September and October 2013. Investigation determined that a member of the Uber team brought Kalanick by Commissioner Edmonson's office on September 13, 2013, but none of the witnesses had a recollection of the reason for the meeting or the substance of the meeting. Additionally, Commissioner Edmonson's calendar showed an entry on October 21, 2013, reflecting a conference call to Kalanick. None of the witnesses recall the substance of the call or whether it even took place. A review of evidence submitted by Davis consisted of items including a YouTube video and a witness which were not materially relevant to the allegations set forth in his complaint. Consequently, there is insufficient evidence to substantiate the alleged lobbying activity by Kalanick referenced in the complaint.

On December 16, 2016, in open session, the Ethics Commission found No Probable Cause to sustain the charge of unregistered lobbying and dismissed the complaint.

Therefore it is:

**ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** that COMPLAINT C 16-32 is hereby dismissed.
