**PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER**

J. C. Planas, a private citizen, filed the above-referenced complaint against Respondents, Antonio Arce (Arce) and Jason Swift (Swift). Arce and Swift served on a City of Miami selection committee for a Public Service Radio Network. Arce, a City of Hialeah employee and Swift, a City of Coral Gables employee, have expertise in public service radio equipment. They each had served on selection committees in their respective cities involving Motorola and Harris Corporation. Planas alleged, among other things, that Arce and Swift had an inherent bias against Motorola. Planas alleged that having Arce and Swift on the City of Miami selection committee violated the National Institute of Government Procurement Code of Ethics (NIGPCE).

On May 10, 2017, the Ethics Commission accepted the Advocate's recommendation that the complaint be dismissed as Not Legally Sufficient since it failed to allege a violation of any provisions of the Miami-Dade County Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics. The Ethics Commission does not enforce the NIGPCE.


Wherefore it is:
