PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER

Complainant, Victor May (May), is a private citizen and resident of the Town of Surfside (the Town). May filed this complaint against all the elected officials of the Town as well as the Town Manager, Town Attorney, Police Chief, Town Clerk and several department heads.

May alleged that Town officials violated the Town Charter, specifically Article VII entitled "Emergency Management Procedures" during the days leading up to and after Hurricane Irma by, among other things, "escaping" from the Town in a state of emergency leaving the Town "for (sic) the mercy of strangers, looters, prowlers, possible terrorists and enemies in case of natural disasters, terrorists' attacks and war."

The Ethics Commission does not have jurisdiction to enforce the Town's Charter provisions. The complaint does not reference any alleged violations of the Miami-Dade County Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics or any other matter within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission.

On October 12, 2017, in open session, the Ethics Commission found that the complaint was NOT legally sufficient and dismissed the complaint.

Wherefore it is:

**ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** that COMPLAINT C 17-25 is hereby concluded.
