**PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER**

Randall Hilliard filed this complaint against Jack Finglass, Nancy Liebman and Kirk Paskal, members of the City of Miami Beach Historic Preservation Board (HPB), a quasi-judicial board. Respondents are also members of the Miami Design Preservation League, a non-profit organization. Hilliard alleged that Respondents are conducting their board meetings in violation of Section 286.0115, Florida Statutes, by discussing with property owners, outside publicly noticed meetings, projects that will come before the HPB.

A legally sufficient complaint exists where there are allegations of violations within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission. The allegation set forth herein implicates Chapter 286 of the Florida Statutes (the Sunshine Law) which is not enforced by the Ethics Commission.

On January 9, 2019, in closed session, the Ethics Commission's Staff Attorney recommended that the case be dismissed. In open session, the Ethics Commission voted unanimously to find No Legal Sufficiency and dismissed the case.

Wherefore it is:

**ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** that COMPLAINT C18-49-11 A, B, C against Respondents, Finglass, Liebman and Paskal, is hereby dismissed.
