Thank you for contacting the Miami-Dade Commission on Ethics and Public Trust and requesting our guidance regarding relatives of Miami-Dade County employees or officials seeking to contract with the County.

Facts:

You advise that you are a principal of Miami Dade Steel, LLC and that while you are not a County employee, your father is the County Mayor.

Through your company, Miami Dade Steel, LLC you would like to purchase County owned land in deep south Miami-Dade County that is located close to the former Homestead Airforce Base. The planned use of land will be the development of a metal recycling facility and micro steel mill.

Issue:

Whether the Miami-Dade County Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics Ordinance ("County Ethics Code") would prevent Miami Dade Steel, LLC from transacting with the County, given your father's position as the County Mayor.

Discussion and Opinion:

Your inquiry involves several sections of the County Ethics Code which are analyzed below:

A. Contracting with the County

The County Ethics Code at Sections 2-11.1 (c)(2) and (d) allow you to transact and enter into a contract, individually or through a firm, with Miami-Dade County, as long as the contract does not interfere with the full and faithful discharge of your father's duties to the County.

This means that Mayor Carlos Gimenez shall not participate in any manner in the sale or purchase of the sought-after County owned property. *See* County Ethics Code §§ 2-11.1 (c) and (n).

B. Exploitation of Official Position

The County Ethics Code prohibits County employees from exploitation of their official position. In this instance, it means, again, that your father may not use his County position to secure **special privileges or exemptions** with respect to any County contract to which Miami Dade Steel, LLC is applying. *See* County Ethics Code § 2-11.1(g).

Your father has previously, by written memorandum, informed the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to Section 5.03(D) of the Miami-Dade Charter, that he has formally recused himself from participating in any decisions related to any projects involving Miami-Dade Steel, LLC. In doing so, pursuant to the Charter, the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners shall exercise and discharge the Mayor's authority and duties in any matters involving Miami-Dade Steel, LLC.

A copy of the Mayor's Recusal Memorandum is attached.

This opinion is limited to the facts as you presented them to the Commission on Ethics and is limited to an interpretation of the County Ethics Code only and is not intended to interpret state laws. Questions regarding state ethics laws should be addressed to the Florida Commission on Ethics.

INQs are informal ethics opinions provided by the legal staff after being reviewed and approved by the Executive Director. INQs deal with opinions previously addressed in public session by the Ethics Commission or within the plain meaning of the County Ethics Code. RQOs are opinions provided by the Miami-Dade Commission on Ethics and Public Trust when the subject matter is of great public importance or where there is insufficient precedent. While these are informal opinions, covered parties that act contrary to the opinion may be referred to the Advocate for preliminary review or investigation and may be subject to a formal Complaint filed with the Commission on Ethics and Public Trust.
