Mr. Haage,

Based on the opinion handed down by the Ethics Commission, an employee who has three or more rental units must receive permission to engage in outside employment and must report such income earned from this endeavor by the filing deadline. The question that was presented to the Ethics Commission did not involve the owner of a triplex; however, there was some discussion about a person who owned property with multiple units, such as a duplex or an apartment building, and whether this should be counted as one unit. The Commission felt that the number of rental units was the critical consideration, not the number of properties owned. Therefore, if you are actively involved in renting out 3 or more properties (as opposed to being a passive investor), you need to adhere to abovementioned outside employment rules. The fact that you have not established a corporation for this purpose has no bearing on whether such activity is defined as outside employment.
