Luciano:

A retired County employee may bid on a County contract but is not permitted to lobby the County for two years after separating from the County. If bidding on a County contract would require personal appearances before a County board or committee, meeting with the Manager or his designee or appearing before the Board of County commissioners, such activities would be considered lobbying and are not permitted for a two year period. If the retired County employee has a business partner, the partner could lobby the County. Therefore, no prohibition exists against a retired County employee from receiving a County contract immediate after retiring, rather the provision simply precludes that individual from lobbying County officials for two years.
