Hi Robert- do you agree that a city commissioner who owns a local magazine publishing company may accept a membership upgrade from a private marketing council (of which the commissioner has been a long time(preelection) member) in exchange for the commissioner's firm performing services to build, promote and manage a modern web site of the marketing council, and that such marketing council membership upgrade would **not** be considered to be a Gift under Sec. 2-11.1 (e), since the performance of such web site improvement services constitutes " adequate and lawful consideration" for the membership upgrade? The upgraded annual membership level from the marketing council has a value of Five Thousand (\$5,000) Dollars. The work to be performed to build and promote the web site has a value of Twelve to Fifteen Thousand (\$12,000-\$15,000) Dollars. Once the web site is completed and promoted, it is envisioned that the commissioner's firm will manage the web site and share future advertising revenue from the web site with the marketing council.

I noticed that under the State Ethics Code (which I recognize is outside of your responsibility) there is a specific definitional exemption for this type of private business transaction under 112. 312(12) (b)(1), F.S.

Please advise. Thank you.
