If it is purely a volunteer position and the employee does not keep any of the \$6,000 – she is merely reimbursed for the travel expenses she has incurred not to exceed \$6,000, then it would not be considered outside employment and she would not have to file the form. If she were permitted to retain a portion of the \$6,000 (assuming she did not have travel expenses for a particular year of at least \$6,000), then she has income and it needs to be reported.
