Mr. Berlin,

In response to your recent questions about the Coconut Grove Village Council, we have determined that the Ethics Commission does <u>not</u> have jurisdiction over its members. This is because the Village Council was privately founded in the 1990s by residents of the City of <u>Miami</u> and was not created by an act of city or county government. Additionally, the Village Council has no governmental authority, but serves only as a forum to discuss issues that concern residents and businesses in Coconut Grove and to bring these issues to the attention of local government.

Furthermore, because they function within a privately established entity, members of the Coconut Grove Village Council are <u>not</u> required to file financial disclosure statements under the County Code at Sec. 2-11.1 (i).

In the past, the Miami City Commission has granted the Coconut Grove Village Council the right to "piggy-back" on the City's election ballot in order to have the Village Council's slate of candidates added to the City's ballot. This appears to be a courtesy extended to the local residents, but the cost of piggy-backing is born entirely by the Coconut Grove Village Council, at no expense to the City.
