On July 12, 2012, you asked about limitations in contracting with the County through the legal firm of Sandler, Travis & Rosenberg, P.A. Your daughter, Hydi Webb, is employed by the Seaport Department as the Manager of Seaport Business Development.

MIRIAM S. RAMOS DEPUTY GENERAL COUNSEL

The County Ethics Code at Sec. 2-11.1 (c)(2) allows you to enter into a contract, individually or through a firm, with Miami-Dade County, as long as the contract does not interfere with the full and faithful discharge of your daughter's duties to the County.

This means that Hydi Webb shall not participate in determining the contract requirements or in awarding the contract. Additionally, none of Ms. Webb's job responsibilities and job descriptions shall require her to be involved in the contract in any way including, but not limited to, its enforcement, oversight, administration, amendment, extension, termination or forbearance. In your case, this means that Sandler, Travis & Rosenberg, P.A., shall not enter into contracts with the Miami-Dade County Seaport Department.

This opinion construes the Miami-Dade County Ethics Code as it applies to County employee-vendors at Sec. 2-11.1 (c)(2) only. It is not applicable to any conflicts under other sections of the County Code or to issues related to state or federal laws.
