Subject: INQ 12-183 Ethics Course for Nonprofit Lobbyists

Ms. Mehta.

You are correct that a board member and an officer of a nonprofit organization who register as lobbyists in Miami-Dade County to represent the nonprofit on issues beyond the mere request for a grant must each take the County ethics training course for lobbyists and each pay the \$100 fee for the training course.

Under Sec. 2-11.1 (s)(4) of the County Code, individuals who represent nonprofits, without reimbursement for the appearance, on matters other than seeking grants, must register as lobbyists but are exempt from paying lobbyist registration fees. As registered lobbyists, however, these individuals are required to take the lobbyist ethics training course and to pay the fee for the course.

On the other hand, individuals representing nonprofits, without compensation, solely for the purpose of requesting grants, are *not* included in the definition of lobbyists and are *not* required to register as lobbyists. Consequently, they are *not* required to take the course on ethics training for lobbyists. (See Sec. 2-11.1 (s)(1)(b).)

Robert Meyers was at our office this morning to teach the annual ethics course. I had a question that he could not answer, and he suggested that I send an inquiry to you.

I represent a not-for-profit organization. A board member and an officer intend to file Miami-Dade County lobbyist registration forms in order to discuss issues that may go beyond the mere request for a grant. (Compare Sec. 2-11.1(s)(1)(b)).

It appears to me that the board member and the officer will need to take the ethics course. (See Sec. 2-11.1(s)(d)). The City of Miami, apparently, does not require that not-for-profit board members or officers take their ethics course. Am I correct in thinking that Miami-Dade County does not have such an exemption?

I want to make sure that my clients are in compliance, so I would appreciate your guidance. Thank you.
