Mr. Pepe,

In response to your question below, an architect has no conflicts of interest under the County or City ethics codes to serve on a review board under the following circumstances:

- the architect, through his architectural firm, has a subcontract with a developer that is building a project in the city, but
- the project by the developer has already received final approval from the review board in question and thus will not go before that board again.

Because the developer has no matters that will come before the review board in the future, a conflict will not be created between the architect's private interests (through the subcontract with the developer) and the public interest. *See* Miami-Dade County Ethics Code at Sec. 2-11.1 (l) and South Miami Code of Ethics at Sec. 8A-1 (k).
