Only full-time County employees are required to obtain permission to engage in outside employment. *See* the Miami-Dade County Code at Sec. 2-11.

However, because you retired from the County Police Department less than two years ago, on June 24, 2011, please be advised that you are prohibited from lobbying the County until June 25, 2013. This prohibition might apply if you were seeking to influence an official decision that could benefit a third party or you personally. Lobbying on behalf of government entities, educational institutions, and nonprofit organizations is allowed under this provision. *See* the Miami-Dade County Code at Sec. 2-11.1 (q).
