I discussed your inquiry with our Executive Director, Joe Centorino. We are both of the opinion that your "internal raffle" solution would violate the ethics code.

It would be acceptable for the office of the City Attorney to enter Universal Court Reporter's raffle since that is apparently open to all of its clients, however, if the City Attorney's office was fortunate enough to win the raffle, the i-pad could only be used for City related purposes. In effect, the i-pad would become City property and it would be just as inappropriate to internally "auction off" the i-pad as it would be to internally auction off any other piece of City owned property.
