Gerald Sanchez, Assistant County Attorney, inquired regarding whether, in a situation where one of the members named to a public board may designate another person to serve on the board in his or her stead, and the original appointee wants to speak with a different member of the same board concerning board business, the conversation between the original appointee and the other board member would have to be held in the Sunshine. I advised him that in a case where an appointee designates another to serve in his or her stead and then maintains contact with that person to discuss board business in order for the designee to carry out the original appointee's wishes, then the original appointee could not meet privately with another board member to discuss board business and such meetings would need to be held in the Sunshine.
