Mr. Lemondo:

It was pleasure speaking with you. You advise that you are a newly appointed member to the NW 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue CRA and you inquired about which section of the County Ethics Code deals with voting conflicts for board members.

Section 2-11.1(v) of the County Ethics Code addresses voting conflicts for board members. It states that no board member:

“... vote on any matter presented to an advisory board or quasi-judicial board on which the person sits if the board member will be directly affected by the action of the board on which the member serves, **and** the board member has any of the following relationships with any persons or entities appearing before the board: (i) officer, director, partner, of counsel, consultant, employee, fiduciary or beneficiary; or (ii) stockholder, bondholder, debtor or creditor.”

I am also attaching a document recently prepared by the Ethics Commission that delineates potential ethical issue for board members which you may find useful.
