Reminder for ethics campaign course

Candidates, campaign workers and politically active citizens involved in local elections are welcome to the "Clean Campaign Class" sponsored by the Miami-Dade Commission on Ethics and Public Trust next week. Votes are scheduled in several cities during the remainder of 2015, including Miami, Miami Beach, Hialeah and Homestead. Additionally, elections for many municipal positions, along with county, state and federal offices, will be held throughout 2016. Attending these sessions will give candidates and their staffs advance preparation.

The two-hour seminar will take place from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. on Monday, July 20 at Miami City Hall. Speakers - including representatives from the Ethics Commission and the Elections Department -- will provide essential information on legal pitfalls, fundraising and record keeping to candidates, campaign treasurers, volunteers and anyone else who wants to understand the legal and ethical obligations of seeking public office.

The class is free and open to the public. Attorneys can earn Continuing Legal Education credits from the Florida Bar.
