**PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER**

Complainant Stephanie Kienzle (Kienzle), a proclaimed activist, filed this complaint on November 24, 2020, against then municipal candidate for North Miami Beach Commission seta, Daniela Jean (Jean)<sup>1</sup>, alleging that she violated the County Ethics Code by filing a frivolous complaint with Hostmonster.com against Kienzle's website, VotersOpinion.com, for disclosing her home address.

Legal sufficiency exists where the complaint adequately alleges a violation of an ordinance within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission, committed by an individual within the authority of the Ethics Commission, based substantially on the personal knowledge of the complainant and filed with the Ethics Commission within three years of the alleged violation.

Kienzle's "complaint" addresses a private matter which does not involve a violation of the County Ethics Code or any other ordinance within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission.

On January 13, 2021, the Ethics Commission voted unanimously and dismissed the complaint for lack of legal sufficiency.


Wherefore it is:

**ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** that COMPLAINT C 20-47-11 against Respondent Jean is hereby dismissed.
