PUBLIC REPORT AND FINAL ORDER

On or about April 28, 2022, Complainant, Lionel Leger, filed this complaint against his landlord, Marie Janine Bocleau, alleging she ignores his poor living conditions and initiated an eviction against him.

Legal sufficiency exists where the complaint adequately alleges a violation of an ordinance within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission, committed by an individual within the authority of the Ethics Commission, based substantially on the personal knowledge of the Complainant and filed with the Ethics Commission within three years of the alleged violation.

The Ethics Commission does not enforce the County Ethics Code against private parties for private landlord actions.


On June 8, 2022, the Ethics Commission dismissed the complaint for lack of legal sufficiency.

Wherefore it is:

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that COMPLAINT C22-23-04 against the Respondent is hereby dismissed.
