The enabling ordinance that created CTAC permits County employees to sit on the committee. Any specific conflicts that could arise as a result of committee service should be presented to me at the appropriate time -- when an item comes up that a County employee feels could pose a conflict. Other than that, the ordinance does place a cap on the number of County employees who can serve on CTAC. You would have to check with the board secretary for CTAC to determine whether appointing another County employee to the committee will break the cap.
