Ms. Menendez,

Thank you for your request for opinion on behalf of Commissioner Velma Palmer. As I understand it, Commissioner Palmer wishes to communicate with her constituents and is in the process of drafting a letter that details her efforts to serve her community and the letter will also provides the community with information the Commissioner deems useful. There are three questions the Commissioner has asked: 1) Can she send this letter using the City's bulk mail; 2) Can she spend money out of her discretionary account for this purpose and 3) Can she use her official stationery – I assume the stationery identifies her as a commissioner and includes the city seal.

As we discussed in a telephone conversation yesterday, I indicated I was not familiar with the bulk mail rules and suggested you contact the U.S. Postal Service and inquire about whether bulk mail can be used for this type of a mailing. My sense would be that it is probably reasonable and would clearly save the city of South Miami money on postage.

Concerning the other two questions, there is no doubt in my mind that elected officials have a right, and possibly a duty, to inform their constituents about matters of public concern, whether they represent them in local, state or federal government. To the extent the Commissioner wants to explain to her constituents the efforts she has undertaken to represents them, the most effective method is to reach the residents through the U.S. mail. Therefore, using city stationery to accomplish this goal is perfectly acceptable. Furthermore, the rationale behind giving elected officials some discretionary funds is to promote the interests of her constituents and using these resources for keeping her constituents better informed regarding issues being discussed and decided at City Hall is an appropriate use of these discretionary funds.
