I consulted with the County Attorney's Office and our offices would respond to your questions as follows:

- 1) Once you qualify as a candidate by the local clerk for elective office in Miami Gardens, you would be required to take a leave of absence from your county position until the date of the election. If you are elected, you forfeit your position. If you not prevail, you must be reinstated to your former position.
- 2) If you are elected to this office, you would not be permitted to work for MMAP. MMAP is a county agency and the county charter prohibits local elected officials from employment with county agencies.
