Jose,

I understand that you serve on the County's Efficiency and Competition Commission and are seeking guidance about whether a conflict exists that would bar you from serving on this Commission due to the fact the firm has several contracts with the County and you are a limited liability partner with this firm. I discussed this matter with the Ethics Commission's legal counsel and she and I agree that there is no conflict for you to serve on the ECC while the firm, KPMG, transacts business with the County. This conclusion is based on the fact that you do not own a controlling financial interest in the firm, as your interest represents significantly less than the 10% threshold that is established by the ordinance. There is, however, a disclosure requirement that compels you to file a sworn statement with the Clerk's Office identifying such employment with KPMG and the fact that the firm does business with the County.

Moreover, as you mentioned in your e-mail, you would have to recuse yourself from the discussion of any matters that directly or indirectly involve KPMG. With respect to the voting conflicts question, I cannot be more specific. I would prefer to handle such questions on a case-by-case basis. That is, if a situation presents itself that might impact KPMG, you would run it by me before taking action.
