Hi Marienela:

You have requested an ethics opinion regarding outside real estate employment by housing agency employees who, as part of their job requirement/duty, must have an active real estate license.

Generally, the Ethics Commission prefers not to render informal ethics opinions when the matter presented is so broad in scope as to exclude specific details and relevant information which could have an affect upon an official determination by the Ethics Commission. I have reviewed this matter with our Executive Director and we would encourage the individual employees to seek an ethics advisory opinion.

However, as a general rule and based upon previous Ethics Commission opinions, employees may engage in outside employment provided that, (1) they have received permission from the department director; and (2) the employment would not "impair his or her independence of judgment in the performance of his or her public duties." [See section 2-11.1 (j) of the Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics Ordinance]

Additionally, Sec. 2-11.1 (h) prohibits an employee from disclosing confidential information acquired through his or her official position for personal gain or benefit or from accepting employment which might require him or her to disclose confidential information acquired on the job.
