RE: REQUEST FOR ADVISORY OPINION RQO 99-01

Dear Mr. Barquin:

The Commission on Ethics and Public Trust considered your request for an advisory opinion at its meeting on March 4,1999 and rendered its decision based on the facts stated in your letter.

You requested an opinion as to whether there is a conflict of interest between your part-time work as a structural plans examiner for the City of Miami and your contract work for firms that also contract with the city.

In your letter, you advised the commission that you worked for ten years with Donnell and Duquesne as a structural engineer. Since you left the firm, you have continued to subcontract with the firm on small jobs. You have also served as a part-time structural examiner for the City of Miami and as part of that position reviewed plans submitted by the firm of Donnell and Duquesne. You did not work on the plans submitted by the firm.

The Ethics Commission found that the Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics ordinance does not prohibit you from working for Donnell and Duquesne and working on a part-time basis for the City of Miami as a structural claims examiner. However, you should disclose your employment relationship with persons or businesses that have significant business commitments with the City of Miami as salaried employees are required to do pursuant to Section 2-11.1(f).
