Dear Mr. Wolfe:

The Commission on Ethics and Public Trust considered your request for an advisory opinion at its meeting on November 27, 2001 and rendered its opinion based on the facts stated in your letter.

You requested an opinion regarding your ability to contract with the county to provide Section 8 housing.

In your letter, you advised the Commission that you are an Occupational Therapist for Miami-Dade County Public Schools and would like to contract with the Miami-Dade Housing Agency to provide Section 8 housing. Section 8 is a federally-funded program which subsidizes landlords who rent to low-income tenants.

The Commission found that you may contract with the Miami-Dade Housing Agency to provide Section 8 housing. Section 2-11.1(c) provides that "Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary herein, subsection (c) and (d) shall not be construed to prevent any employee... from entering into any contract, individually or through a firm, corporation, partnership or business entity in which the employee or any member of his or her immediate family has a controlling financial interest, with Miami-Dade County or any person or agency acting for Miami-Dade County as long as 1) entering
