Dear Mr. Garland Curry,

You asked if entering into a contract with the Miami-Dade County Public Housing Agency and/or the Miami-Dade Community Action Agency would create a conflict of interest for you, based on your mother's position with the County as an Assistant County Manager. The program you were considering applying for is the "Housing Assistance Network of Dade" (HAND)—a federally funded program administered by Miami-Dade County.

As we discussed on the phone yesterday, because your mother's position with the County falls within the definition of "departmental personnel," the County Ethics Code prohibits you (and all of your mother's immediate family members) from entering into any contract with any department within the County. See County Code § 2-11.1 (c)(1).

This prohibition can only be waived by the Board of County Commissioners with a 2/3 vote at a public hearing. The process for obtaining a waiver is described in the County Code at § 2-11.1 (c)(4).
