Hello David,

Robert Meyers asked me to respond to your question about a city board member doing business with the city. You are correct that Sec. 2-11.1 (c)(3) of the County Code allows the board member to enter into a contract with the city **as long as the contact will not be "subject to the regulation, oversight, management, policy-setting or quasi-judicial authority of the board of which the person is a member."**

Consequently, a member of the city's Charter Review Board may continue to provide public information services to the city as long as the Charter Review Board does not have any jurisdiction over, or involvement with, the services provided by the board member.
