Mr. Wolfe,

You asked us to review a letter from Mayor Ramon Rodriquez, Mayor of the Town of Medley, seeking donations on behalf of the Town of Medley Foundation.

In sum, the Mayor's letter does not violate the County Ethics Code.

The County Code at Sec. 2-11.1 (e)(2)(g) allows elected officials to solicit gifts on behalf of nonprofit organizations if the gift is used solely by that organization and as long as neither the elected official nor anyone on his staff receives any compensation as a result of the solicitation. Compensation is defined as any money, gift, favor, political contribution, thing of value, or other financial benefit.

We understand that the Town of Medley Foundation is 501(c)(3) Florida nonprofit corporation. You stated that no one in the town will be compensated as a result of the solicitation but that all households in Medley, including those of elected officials, receive turkeys for Thanksgiving.

Considering that the number of households of elected officials makes up less than 1.5% of the class of all households receiving turkeys, the gift to elected officials is not a special benefit that would affect the mayor in a manner distinct from the public generally. (In the 2000 census, Medley had 363 households; it currently has 5 elected officials.) Consequently, the prohibition regarding soliciting gifts is not triggered.
