Ms. Simon,

There is nothing in the Miami-Dade County Conflict of Interest Ordinance that prohibits a County employee from running for office in a municipality.

The Miami-Dade County charter does, however, speak precisely to this issue.

"Any appointed official or *employee* of Dade County who qualifies as a candidate for election to any federal, state or *municipal* office shall immediately take a leave of absence from his or her county position until the date of the election and shall, if elected, immediately forfeit his or her county position. If the candidate is not elected, he or she shall immediately be reinstated to his or her former position." Sec. 1.05(C).
