Dear Mr. Restrepo:

On January 8, 2014, you asked about limitations in doing business with the County through your privately owned company, Industrial Trading Solutions Corp. Your spouse, Nathalia Salas-Restrepo, is employed by the Miami Dade Parks and Recreation Department as a PROS Special Events Coordinator.

The County Ethics Code at Secs. 2-11.1 (c) (2) and (d) allows you to enter into a contract, individually or through a firm, with Miami-Dade County, as long as the contract does not interfere with the full and faithful discharge of your spouse's duties to the County. This means that your spouse, Nathalia Salas-Restrepo shall not participate in determining the contract requirements or in awarding the contract. Additionally, none of Ms. Salas-Restrepo's job responsibilities and job descriptions shall require her to be involved in the contract in any way including, but not limited to, its enforcement, oversight, administration, amendment, extension, termination or forbearance. In your case, this means that Industrial Trading Solutions Corp, shall not enter into contracts with the Miami Dade County Parks and Recreation Department.

This opinion construes the Miami-Dade County Ethics Code as it applies to County employee-vendors at Secs. 2-11.1 (c)(2) and (d)only. It is not applicable to any conflicts under other sections of the County Code or to issues related to state or federal laws.
