Director Copeland:

You have inquired regarding whether your participation as a paid consultant at the IACP Law Enforcement Leadership Institute on Juvenile Justice in Seattle during September 2014 would be considered part of your regular duties as department director or outside employment.

The answer to this question would depend on whether it was an authorized use of your County time by the person to whom you report and whether or not you receive personal compensation for your participation.

If you are to receive and accept compensation for your participation, which is indicated by the correspondence, then it is outside employment. You would need to request and receive authorization from your supervisor for this work and to fill out and file the County form on outside employment required by Section 2-11.1(k)(2) of the Code, as well as to utilize your available annual leave time to attend. Because it serves an educational purpose, I do not see it as prohibited outside employment under Miami-Dade Code Section 2-11.1(j)

If you decline to accept the compensation, and attend as a volunteer participant rather than a paid consultant, then it may be an authorized use of your time if it is approved by your supervising authority. If it is not approved, you may not participate. However, even if approved, if the IACP is a county vendor or consultant then you could not accept the paid travel, hotel, meals or other such incidentals pursuant to Section 2-11.1(w) unless that prohibition is waived by the Board of County Commissioners. If it is approved and the IACP is not a county vendor or contractor, and you accept the travel and lodging expenses, then you should still report such acceptance as a gift pursuant to Section 2-11.1(e)(4) on the appropriate gift disclosure form.
