Two opportunities to learn ethical campaigning

Candidates, campaign workers and politically active citizens involved in local elections have two opportunities over the next several weeks to do it properly by attending "Clean Campaign Classes" sponsored by the Miami-Dade Commission on Ethics and Public Trust. Votes are scheduled in several cities during the remainder of 2015, including Miami, Miami Beach, Hialeah, Homestead and Virginia Gardens. Additionally, elections for many municipal positions, along with county, state and federal offices, will be held throughout 2016. Attending these sessions will give candidates and their staffs advance preparation.

The two-hour seminars will take place from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 11, in the Virginia Gardens

Town Hall and at the same time on Monday, July 20 at Miami City Hall. Speakers -- including representatives
from the Ethics Commission and the Elections Department -- will provide essential information on fundraising
and record keeping to candidates, campaign treasurers, volunteers and anyone else who wants to understand
the legal and ethical obligations of seeking public office.

The events are free and open to the public. Attorneys can earn Continuing Legal Education credits from the Florida Bar.
